Covid Vaccinations

After the Prime Minister's announcement we will be re-joining the vaccination programme on Monday 20th December. If you are aged over 18 and have not been fully vaccinated you will receive a text invite to book an appointment online at Little Paxton Surgery. If you do not receive this text and had your last Covid vaccination over 3 months ago please contact the surgery. Please note you should not have the vaccination within 28 days of a positive Covid test.

Phones

The cabling for the new phone system is being fitted in February 22. Once this has been completed the new system should be operational early spring. We appreciate your continued patience during this time.

Research – Active Brains

The surgery is supporting the Active Brains Study – This is a website which aims to help older adults to look after their brain and body health. To prevent problems with things like remembering, concentrating or reasoning (known as cognitive decline).

Monthly appt data

Over 17,000 consultations have been carried out between 1st September and 30th November. Out of this 49.6% were attended in person.

Flu vac data

All patients aged over 50 and those who have specific underlying health conditions, are currently pregnant or who looks after someone are eligible for a free Flu Vaccination under the NHS before the end of March 2022.

Children aged 2-3 years old on 31st August 2021 should have a nasal flu vaccination at the surgery. School age children should have the nasal vaccination through the school nurses.

So far **2856** eligible patients have received their flu vaccine at the surgery.

Dispensary

From January 3rd we will no longer take telephone calls to order repeat medication, this is to improve patient safety and to free up phone lines for patients needing to contact the surgery. You can use the NHS app https://www.nhs.uk/nhs-app/ to order your repeat medication and book appointments. Alternatively paper prescription requests can be placed in the boxes outside both surgeries.
