**NEW FLOORING** 



If you have recently been to Buckden Surgery you may have noticed the new flooring. We have removed all carpet from clinical areas and revamped the waiting areas and corridors with wood-effect flooring. This better meets infection prevention and control parameters and also, we hope you agree, looks wonderful.



Can we remind our patients that though both surgeries are shut to the public on a Thursday afternoon from 2pm, (dispensary shuts at 1pm), it is possible to contact the emergency on-call doctor here at the surgery if you feel you cannot wait until the morning. Please call the usual number and listen to the options to ring the duty doctor. On-the-day emergency appointments will also be available on Friday morning when our phones open at 8am. An oncall doctor is also available from 5pm until 6:00pm on a Friday evening if you feel you cannot wait until Monday morning.



We now have free Wi-Fi available at Buckden surgery. The Wi-Fi is perfect for the odd web browsing whilst waiting but will not be powerful enough to download tonight's movie! But we do hope you won't be sitting in the waiting room too long though! Please remember to take calls outside and turn phones to silent/vibrate to help alleviate disturbances to other patients.

Can we once again remind patients at Buckden surgery to please park between the yellow bollards as sensibly as possible on the opposite side of the car park.
