"I joined the Buckden Surgery 25yrs ago with Dr Morris and Dr Hodson in a five roomed bungalow in Silver Street with seven staff and 5,000 patients. We did our own on-call sharing with two other practices on the A1 and rural General Practice was very different then. We had just installed our first computer which was at the forefront of technology in those days, before mobile phones and the internet. How things have changed!

We now look after 8,500 patients with seven Doctors in a two storey building and a branch surgery with a total of 26 staff. Technology has moved on as everything is electronic, patients are living longer and we can do so much more in General Practice than we ever could do before. The future is that practices will grow and services will merge outside hospitals as the demand for health care increases."

For new patients who would like online access to their repeat medication list, online appointment booking or medical record access, in order to comply with information governance regulations, we must ask for photographic ID. This can be a passport, driving licence (with picture), certain organisation's ID badges or proof of age card. This means that your partner/spouse must apply for their access PIN in person with their photo ID. This also applies to anyone requiring the use of online access who are 16 and over. Any parent requiring access for children under 16yrs must bring their children into the Surgery to verify their ID. Children who turn 16 will need to apply in person to activate their own access PIN. If a patient is housebound the GP who knows the patient can vouch for this patient if required. For those patients already enjoying this service, there is no change.

Car Park at Buckden



Can we once again remind patients to please park between the yellow bollards and as sensibly as possible on the opposite side of the car park. It never ceases to amaze our team how one car can take up so much room due to careless parking! We do struggle for space some days so we are really grateful for courteous parking.

Remember that a bicycle rack is available in the car park at the foot of the staff entrance stairs should you wish to use it.

A gentle reminder that the car park is for patient use and not a car park for the adjacent cemetery. We would respectfully ask those visiting the cemetery to find alternative parking.

Cars parked in our car park are parked at the owners' risk.
